## Goals for Events

- Increase awareness of PrEP and PEP in high-impact communities
- Normalize conversations about HIV prevention
- Link community members to local resources
- Center sex positivity and health equity

# Step-by-Step Organizer Checklist

#### 1. Pick Your Event Format

(Choose one that aligns with your audience)

#### **Potential Event Ideas:**

- Barbershop/salon pop-in
- PrEP party/Community mixer
- On-site testing/PrEP screening
- Open mic, storytelling night

- Art/photography exhibit with health booth
- Film screening/Health panel
- Workshops/trainings/Health fair
- Pop-up PrEP Clinic/Mobile Testing

#### 2. Secure the Details

- Date & Time
- Location/venue
- Partner organizations or co-hosts (optional)
- Transportation or incentives (gift cards, food, SEPTA pass)

#### 3. Brand It Up

#### All events must include:

 City of Philadelphia Health Dept & Philly PrEP Awareness Week logo

#### Hashtag:

#PhillyPrEPAwarenessWeek2025

#### 4. Promote Your Event

- Submit event details for the official city calendar
- Use social media graphics from PrEP Awareness Week Toolkit
- Cross-promote with CBO partners, clinics, and influencers
- Invite potential PrEP clients and/or community leader

#### 5. Prep for the Day Of

 Have a designated event lead + check-in point

#### Set up a resource table with:

- PrEP/PEP flyers, referral guides
- Safer sex kits, condoms, swag
- Local clinic info + sign-up sheets
- Collect contact info for follow-up and services
- Take photos/videos (with consent) for recap and promotion

#### 6. After the Event

### Submit to PDPH via emailing preventhiv@phila.gov:

- Attendance count & basic demographics
- 1–2 photos (with captions/credits)
- Quick summary of how it went
- Optional: Share testimonials, quotes, or mini video recap
